- District 1 Council Office Update (Councilmember Chappie Jones)
 - Homeless roundtable
 - City received funding \$200K + match from Destination Homes
 - City to start neighborhood dialog on homelessness
 - Q: what is county doing?
 - Already spending in the millions \$
 - We will invite county supervisor Susan Ellenberg to future D1LG meeting
 - Need county to adopt Laura's law
 - Q: Does the city oppose using the fairgrounds to house homeless?
 - No, Chappie to draft a letter to county to voice support
 - Q: Does District 1 website describe homeless roundtable?
 - No, still planning. Looking for community to help plan
 - Q: Is homeless issue same in all Districts?
 - No, District 7 has more
 - Q: Can this Homeless Roundtable influence city's plans?
 - Yes, that is the intent
 - Q: Does plan include mental health support for homeless?
 - We invited NAMI next D1LG meeting

 - Asked CVS and said daily, all around
 - Impacting business, adding security helps, cameras

 - O: Is there a timetable for El Paseo development?

- SJ Homelessness Team Update
 - (Ken gave quick recognition to Rotating Safe Car program volunteers)
 - Presented by Lorena Diez, SJ Housing Dept
 - See https://www.sanjoseca.gov/Directory.aspx?did=111
 - Website still in development
 - Recent volunteer survey to count homeless
 - 6172 homeless in SJ, 83% unsheltered, 84% are local
 - Over 9000 in county
 - Strategic plan city and county
 - 5 yr Plan: disrupt system, build solution (task force), serve person
 - Total 6937 homeless were housed 2015-2018
 - Prevention more cost effective
 - Destination Home, assisted over 700 families
 - Interview and approval process
 - Housing solutions
 - Permanent supportive housing
 - Bond money, measure A
 - Market rate rent around \$3200/mo require 3x min wage jobs
 - ELI (extremely low income) is scaled
 - Q: is SJ min wage linked to ELI?
 - Don't know
 - Interim housing (mini, Plaza hotel)
 - Bridge community
 - http://www.sanjoseca.gov/bridgehousingcommunities
 - Crisis Response Intervention
 - Evening shelters
 - Respond to homeless reports
 - Dignity on wheels (shower, etc.)
 - Other programs (mostly churches)
 - Temporary shelter permits
 - Rotating Safe Car
 - Map of homeless by district
 - See copy slides
 - Q: How to contact Destination Home? Now 7 locations, West Valley Community Center is closest
- Urban Confluence Overview
 - Presented by Steve Borkenhagen
 - Long time resident of SJ
 - Recognized need for iconic architectural or artistic landmark
 - Original light tower fell early 1900's
 - Iconic landmarks examples
 - Eiffel tower
 - Guggenheim Museums in NYC
 - Statue Liberty
 - Butchart gardens Victoria
 - Site selection study complete
 - Using no city funding, over \$1M raised
 - Looking for icon using technology, art, architecture
 - o Idea input starts this week, anyone can submit
 - Jury will select 3 and fund \$150K to create a plan for each

 - Q: SJ height restrictions? Yes, 200-250 feet (arena is 130 ft)
 - Q: Icon count include the river? Yes!

- Q: How long is idea submission? Open till Oct, choose Dec, final in May
