D1 Leadership Group Meeting Minutes - 11 May 2019

Meeting opened 9:02 AM

- General Business
 - o Agenda and Minutes
 - January and March minutes approved by unanimous vote
 - Treasurer's Report
 - Balance \$5906.31 (see Treasurer's Report)
 - Received 5 requests for funds for driveway parties and dumpster days
- SJ 2019 Road Paving Project
 - o Binh Tran is managing the SJ residential street repair project
 - PCI (pavement condition index) ranges from 21 to 90
 - PCI 50 and below requires major rework
 - Since 2012 major streets were maintained, but local streets (1490 miles) were not
 - Funding from VTA measure B, Prop 6 continue gas tax and Measure T in 2020
 - Plan to repair or resurface all streets in the next 9 years
 - Start with 248 miles of streets in 2019
 - O Delay work in areas with project that will tear up streets
 - Trying to balance the work across districts
 - Using novel in-place methods (reuse the old material so less waste)
 - Residents to be notified 2 weeks in advance
 - See details at http://sanjoseca.gov/transportation
 - Can still use MySanJose app to report potholes. Fixed within 48 hours.
 - Question: How is quality of work controlled?
 - Most work will be public works or DOT
 - O Question: Will work be coordination with SJ bike plan?
 - Yes
 - Question: Will Bollinger update be coordinate with Cupertino
 - Yes, likely in 2020
- District 1 Council Office Update (Councilmember Chappie Jones)
 - Happy Mother's day!
 - Senior walk and great America litter had lower attendance this year
 - D3 had the best turnout and will be our target to beat next year
 - VTA board created new transit plan to move more buses to busy lines
 - 90% rider, 10% coverage
 - Advocated SJ in Sacramento (homeless, disaster prep funds)
 - \$1 dollar of disaster prep saves \$6 later
 - \$12M for emergency response center

- \$3.7M to prevent car break-ins
 - Some local shopping centers see 1 car crime per day
- Coordinated effort between cities
- Development
 - Safeway at Payne and Winchester is coming soon
 - Sand Hill bought El Paseo (more details to follow)
- Beautify SJ
 - Good everyone is using mySJ app, but city is overwhelmed
 - Question: Can Council office publish a list of what people are asking for?
 - Pueblo del Dias wants a community center
- o SJ Homeless Update
 - Tammy story on Saratoga
 - Removed her carts but she refused services
 - City will be reaching out to each district looking for help housing homeless
 - Tiny homes, sanction camps, house subsidies
 - Question: Are we learning from other cities?
 - Yes, Seattle, Portland, Fresno
 - Can we use the fairgrounds?
 - Popular idea, but the county is resisting
 - Question: Are we working with neighboring cities and county
 - Yes
 - Attend city council meetings and voice your concerns!
 - And voice your concerns to County Supervisor Susan Ellenberg
 - Action: Invite Susan to a D1LG meeting
 - Question: Does SB50 mean no more single-family homes?
 - Only affects transit corridors
 - Comment: We've seen the same homeless for decades
 - Fixing homelessness will require a variety of solutions
 - Mental health, economic, etc.
 - Get ahead and include pubic in vetting
 - Mobile home camps? (churches started)
 - Question: Do we get input from homeless what they need?
 - Just did a homeless survey (SJ housing)
 - Question: Do we have pros to deal with mental health?
 - Yes, county does, but can't force homeless to use it
 - Food pantry West Valley (Cupertino)
 - Partially supported by SJ grant
 - Proposal for full funding
 - Plan to expand to Cadillac
 - What causes homeless?
 - Illegal immigrants?
 - Major factor is home values
 - Why was Agnews closed?
 - Mental health/addiction
 - Need intervention/support
 - Action: Invite Jim Bell to a future D1LG meeting to discuss Laura's law
 - Action: D1LG to draft a letter on homeless issue

- Comment: Need to address mental health issues before housing
- Question: Can SJ buy property?
 - City is getting funding
 - Need to provide services
 - Use open land around Valley Med?
- D3 and D7 have bridge housing projects already in progress
 Guy parking cars SJ neighborhoods, renting cars unlicensed from Cupertino office
 - Vehicles are gone now
- o D1 Decides 2019 update
 - 77 ideas submitted so far
 - Submission deadline May 31 (see http://www.d1decides.com)
- Gary commission update
 - See Neighborhood Commission Report
