**NC FY 2021-2022.** The NC is working on the FY 2021-2022 workplan items that include Illegal dumping, code enforcement, neighborhood safety, and the 2022 Neighborhoods Commission candidate caucuses for the odd districts. District 1 will have two open NC seats that will be filled at the 2022 NC caucus. I am terming out. Please contact me for information regarding the Neighborhoods Commission. The NC has two seats on the SJ Reimagining Public Safety Advisory Committee and is participating in the regular and ad-hoc meetings.

**2022 San Jose Budget Feedback.** The Neighborhoods Commission is currently developing a Budget Letter to the Mayor and City Council. The letter provides resident feedback and recommendations on how to spend San Jose funds in the areas of Code Enforcement, Public Safety, and Transportation.

**Independent Citizens Oversight Committee (ICOC) FY 2020-2021.** The committee is in support of Measure B, which enacted a ¼ percent sales tax for 15 years and requires Independent Citizens Oversight with public review of spending, and all revenues controlled locally. The ICOC reviews Measure B revenues annually and reports to the City Council on Measure B during the San Jose annual budget process. The FY 2020-2021 Oversight effort started in October and is in progress. The ICOC is conducting meetings via Zoom. The FY 2020-2021 Oversight Report has been completed and approved by the NC for submittal to the Mayor and Council.
